STAGE II FIRE RESTRICTIONS

Pursuant to 16 USC 551 and 36 CFR 261.50 (a) the following acts are prohibited in the area described in this order and depicted on the attached map hereby incorporated into this order as Exhibit A, all within the Coronado National Forest, in the states of Arizona and New Mexico:

PROHIBITIONS:

1. **Building, maintaining, attending or using a fire, campfire, charcoal, coal, or wood stove fire, including within a developed recreation site, or improved site. 36 CFR 261.52(a)**
 - a. **EXCEPTION: Use of a petroleum-fueled stove, lantern, or heating device is allowed as long as such device meet the fire underwriters specification for safety.**
2. **Using an explosive. 36 CFR 261.52(b)**
3. **Smoking, except within an enclosed vehicle or building. 36 CFR 261.52(d)**
4. **Operating or using any equipment powered by an internal combustion engine, except motor vehicles. 36 CFR 261.52.(h)**
5. **Welding of operating acetylene or other torch with open flame. 36 CFR 261.52(i)**
6. **Discharging a firearm, air rifle, or gas gun, except while engaged in a lawful hunt pursuant to state, federal, or trial law, and regulations. 36 CFR 261.58(m)**
7. **Possessing or operating motor vehicles off National Forest System roads, including but not limited to cars, trucks, SUVs, motorcycles, and ATVs, except for when parking in an area devoid of vegetation within 10 feet of the roadway, and except for parking overnight in Forest Service developed campgrounds and trailheads. 36 CFD 261.56**

EXEMPTIONS:

Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50 (e) the following persons are exempt from this order:

1. Persons with a Forest Service permit specifically authorizing the otherwise prohibited act or omission.
2. Persons using a device solely fueled by liquid petroleum or LPG fuels that can be turned on and off. Such devices can only be used in an area that is barren or cleared of all overhead and surrounding flammable materials within 3 feet of the device.
3. Any Federal, State, or local officer, or member of an organized rescue or firefighting force in the performance of an official duty.
4. Residents, owners and lessees of land, and holders of Forest Service recreational special use authorizations- within the restricted area are exempt from Prohibition No. 1 above, provided such fires are within a permanent structure. (e.g. residence)

RESTRICTED ARES:

All National Forest System lands within the Coronado National Forest, within the states of Arizona and New Mexico.
